

Instructions

COOKS! Thank you for your service. There is nothing better than a group coming back from a long hot day to a home cooked meal. Below are the instructions for all volunteers. Please call Michelle Garcia (610-613-1811) if you ever have a question or need something. Grill nights have separate instructions below.

Dinners: Sunday's, Monday's, Thursday's and Friday's

(We only have on street parking. If you prefer a short walk, you can park one block east of the church in the Acme parking lot and walk back to the church)

Enter the church through the side, office door located on Mt. Pleasant Avenue. The doors will be open daily from 3:30 PM on for cooks. Follow the signs toward the kitchen.

You have the option of cooking at the church or cooking at home and simply preparing to serve in the kitchen at the church. You are welcome to use anything you find in the kitchen for serving the meal.

Every meal should be served with a salad. We will have salad supplies at the church (no need to bring your own). Anything you find in the refrigerators and pantry is free to use.

Dinner is served at 6:00 PM in the room across the hallway from the kitchen. Tables and chairs will be set up along with a serving table. At 6:00 you'll start serving the meal (1st helpings). After everyone has had their first plate sit and eat with the group! This is a time for you to relax and spend some time getting to know the volunteers.

Cleaning up is important because the kitchen is used for 3 meals every day. Kitchen instructions are hanging in the kitchen. It is important to clean and put every dish in its proper place. If there is a significant amount of left over food that you would like to leave and can be frozen use the freezer bags/containers, label the food and date it. Feel free to take home any leftovers.

If you would like to be reimbursed there are forms, pens and a stapler in a bin on the countertop. Fill out a form, staple the receipt to the form and leave it in the bin. We will mail you a check within 1 week.

Lastly, a menu is listed below. This is to prevent everyone from making the same type of dinner/meat every night. Please feel free to be creative or prepare a meal that is different than what is suggested as long as you avoid repeats.

Grill Night Instructions (Every Wednesday)

This is a big job! We need three to four people each Wednesday. We are unable to give you an exact

number of people who will attend but we anticipate an additional 20 to 30 people (in addition to the approximate number of people volunteering with the project that specific week).

Follow the instructions on entering the church, follow signs toward the kitchen. The courtyard is where we will BBQ. Once at the kitchen there will be additional signs leading you to the courtyard. Our desire is to offer a traditional picnic style BBQ. We have a large propane grill to cook on that will be set up and ready for you upon arriving. Volunteers will assist with setting up serving dishes, plates, and utensils. We will provide hamburgers, hot dogs, rolls, fruit and vegetables. Please plan and bring sides (coleslaw, mac/potato salad, chips, etc.). There are two large 5-gallon coolers that can be filled with water, ice tea or lemonade These can be carried up to the courtyard to use for serving drinks at the cookout. Students will help with setting up additional tables and chairs. Food should be ready to begin serving right at 6pm.

We will need some folks to serve the food while others continue to work the grill. Following the meal there is a worship service that we invite all of our participants, neighbors and friends to come to. Please feel welcome to join us after the meal has been served and cleaned up.
